## Why Is Li River So Important

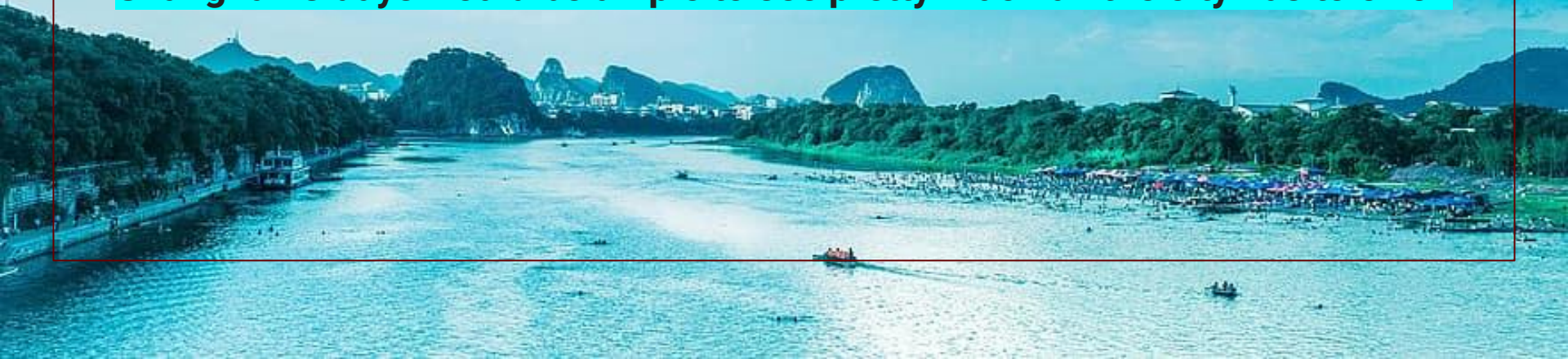

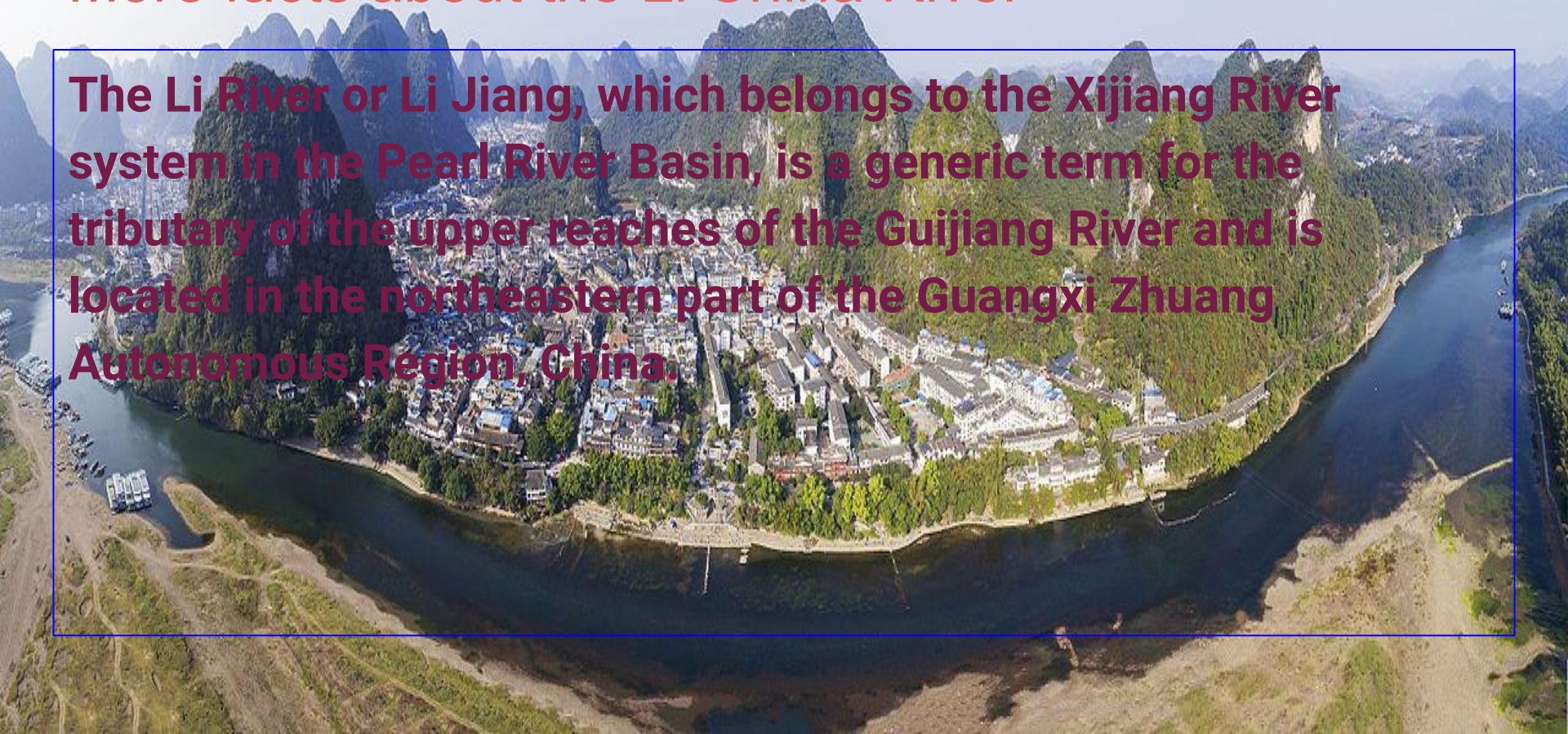


## **Do you think Guillin is Safe**

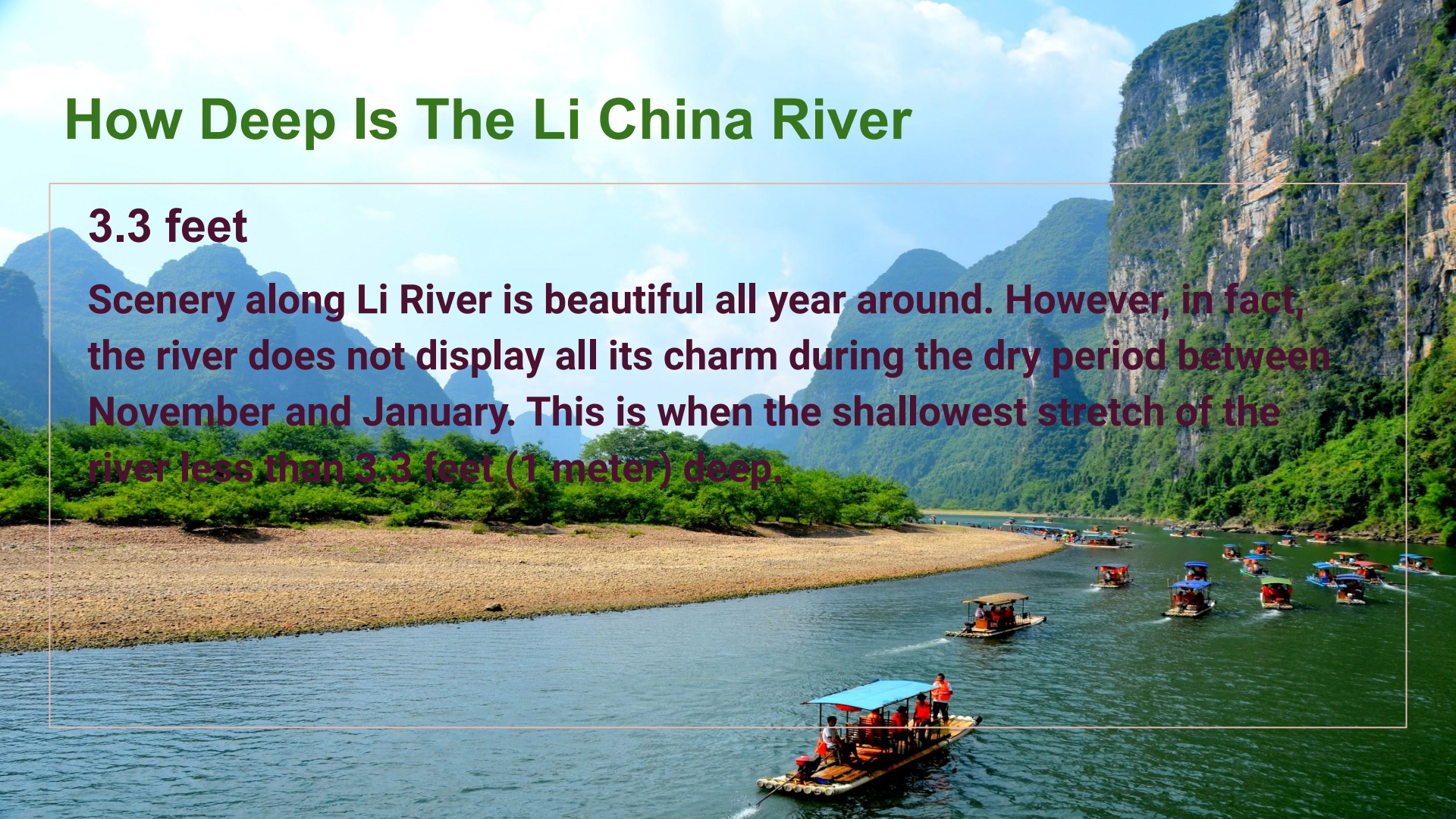

**Scenery along Li River is beautiful all year around. However, in fact, the river does not display all its charm during the dry period between November and January. This is when the shallowest stretch of the river less than 3.3 feet (1 meter) deep.**
